MASTER OF EDUCATION IN ADMINISTRATION

The Master of Education in Administration is a thirty-six hour program designed specifically for those who wish to work towards Principal Certification (catalog.shsu.edu/archives/2017-2018/graduate/college-departments/education/educational-leadership/principal-certification). The program complies with existing standards for professional certification to produce proficient school administrators who are well educated in school administration and organization; effective leadership strategies; campus business management; and federal, state, and local school regulations. Students in this program will also possess the skills necessary to evaluate programs for overall school improvement, implement research to improve instruction and curricula, and understand how diverse populations and special programs affect a school and its community. A comprehensive TEXES examination is required during the final semester of coursework. The study plan originates in the Department of Educational Leadership.

- 5. Official transcript from the baccalaureate degree granting institution with a GPA of 3.0.
- 6. Copy of Teacher Service Record from your school district's Human Resource Department with 2 years of certified teaching experience preferred; however, we will consider applicants with 1 year of certified teaching experience (Applicant must be working at a Texas Education Agency accredited school.)
- 7. Copy of valid Teacher Certificate
- 8. Two Reference Forms (http://www.shsu.edu/programs/principal-certification/Department-of-Educational-Leadership-Principal-Reference-Form.pdf), one from your school principal and one from an assistant principal
- 9. Professional Statement
- 10. Current Resume

NOTE: Applicants selected after the initial screening will be required to complete a video interview and will be required to submit the admission requirements, excluding the reference forms to Tk20 to be considered for official admission to the Principal Certification program as per the Texas Education Agency. Therefore, it is important to keep a copy of the admission requirements.
