- 6. An undergraduate degree from an accredited academic institution.
- 7. Candidates with a 3.0 GPA from the baccalaureate-granting institution or graduate will have the GRE automatically waived. Candidates with an undergraduate GPA between 2.5 and 2.99 from the baccalaureate-granting institution or between 2.8 and 2.99 in graduate level hours from the baccalaureate degree-granting institution are required to take the GRE. These candidates must meet the minimum standard with the following formula:

(GPA X 50) + GRE Verbal + GRE Quantitative + GRE Written equal to or greater than 435

#### **GRE TAKEN BEFORE AUGUST 2011**

(GPA X 200) + GRE Verbal + GRE Quantitative + GRE Written equal to or greater than 1664

If a student has taken graduate level coursework after receiving their Bachelor's, but has not received a Master's degree, then those hours become void and are not taken into consideration.
