**Notes**

Students must earn a 2.0 minimum overall GPA in all coursework.

Students must meet a 2.5 minimum overall major GPA in all major coursework.

Students must earn a 2.0 minimum SHSU GPA in all coursework.

Students must meet a 2.5 minimum SHSU major GPA in all major coursework.

A minimum grade of C is required of Interior Design majors in all FACS, ARTS, and ETCM courses and in all prerequisites for these courses. This program requires a 2.5 GPA.

The Interior Design specific courses (FACS designation) are only offered once per academic year, in either Fall or Spring, as noted in the plan of study with the exception of FACS 1360.

FACS 1360 is a prerequisite for FACS 2364, FACS 2365, FACS 2386, and FACS 2387.

FACS 2364, FACS 2386, and FACS 2387 should be taken concurrently.

FACS 1360 or FACS 2364 is a prerequisite for ETCM 2363.

FACS 3332 and FACS 3337 are prerequisites for FACS 3338.

ETCM 2363 is a prerequisite for FACS 3338.

ARTS 3385 is a prerequisite for ARTS 4384.

Passages of a sophomore portfolio review is required prior to taking FACS 3338.

FACS 4369 requires department approval and the completion of 90 hours.
