They manage healthcare operations, ensure compliance with laws and regulations, research and analyze policies, healthcare delivery, and health insurance.

Core Component Areas II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, and IX (including the one credit hour requirement) could double dip from the core and the minors.

Each minor must have 18 unique credits. Students may have to take more than 18 credits to complete the minor.

Graduation requirements include completing all course requirements along with completing at least 120 hours, 42 advanced hours, 24 advanced in-residence hours, and INTG 4301. Students may need to take general electives and/or advanced general electives outside of courses outlined on their degree plan to meet those requirements.

Students must earn a grade of "C" or better in INTG 3301 and INTG 4301.
